This Burmese traditional holiday lasts for a whole week and features water fights, swimming, games, special desserts, and fun for everyone. This year we dug our own pool and hosted a barbeque on the site where our new Home for the children is being built. We also had our dedication service for the new building during that week. Since the boys have been helping with the construction, it was exciting to them to have services in that place.
