We usually do not take any street children, nor any orphan, who does not have a guardian. Therefore, per the law, we do not come under the government child welfare committee. A few new children want to join our *hostel*, but I am waiting for finalization of the delink process. Currently, the government needs to give permission for us to enroll any more children in the Home, and I don't want them to interfere in the admission process.
