

On a more fun note, let's answer one of our most frequently asked questions: What is on their faces? Thanaka is a traditional cosmetic used by Myanmar people. Girls and boys wear it on their faces as a sunblock and skin protectant. The smell is also said to repel mosquitos! Thanaka is made from a special wood ground on a stone with water until it forms a paste. It is then applied to the skin however the wearer wishes. Our children love to use it and would not be ready for the day without it!

Every day the children pray about the new construction at "168 quarter". They are

so excited about the new home being built and are very thankful to those who have given to make it possible. I
