INDIA NEWS

The Government is trying to change many things regarding children's homes in India. We all need to pray. The present government is against Christian ministries and wants to close them however they can or give them a hard time.

First, they made many amendments to the present rules of receiving funds from abroad. They have even cancelled many Christian organizations because they are receiving funds from churches abroad. They also want to close most of the children's homes. They have given notices to eight states to close children's homes, mostly Christian operated. The reason they give is that the children need to grow with the family and if a child does not have parents, then the child needs to go to a government adoption center. A few have challenged this decision in court, but we do not know the outcome.

With the virus yet on the rise, we do not know when schools will reopen. We also have not received any notification regarding the children returning. If the children return, acquire Covid-19 at school, and it spreads to other children in the homes then the parents and government will blame the administration. So kindly pray for this unusual situation. All the children are doing fine and are anxious to return. However, we all wait and watch closely the developments.
