Mexico Missionary Jonathan Bryan went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, April 2, 2025. He was saved as a teenager in a boy's home, and he immediately became deeply concerned for souls, leading many of his "brothers" to the Lord. In Mexico, he was used to plant five churches, and we partnered with him in 2010 as helpers in the Lighthouse Children's Home there.

On the day of his homegoing, he had led five people to the Lord at a funeral. After Wednesday night service, while knocking on doors, the Lord took him,

much like He did with Enoch—suddenly. Seven more were saved at his memorial in Mexico, and the couple whose door he had knocked, was also later led to the Lord.

The stateside funeral took place in his home church, Harvest Baptist Church in Edinburgh, Texas, at the end of their annual Missions Conference on April 17th. Though we don't always understand it, God's timing is always so perfect!

Laura and son, Wyatt, and the children of the Home, surely need our prayers - as does Iglesia Biblica Bautista De Redentor (Bible Baptist Church of the Redeemer) as they continue to seek the Lord's help and guidance.
