named Ester (pictured here). Ester, age 5, was born to a 14 year old mother who passed Ester off to an elderly relative. The relative was not able financially or physically to tend to Ester, but tried to do so for 3



months before she herself was overcome trying to tend to the newborn. Ester was then passed to Pastor Goong who recently learned that the mother is now in jail. Lord willing, she will now have clothing, shoes, underclothes, toys, go to school, be loved and hear the good news about Jesus. This place is far more than just a Home; it literally is a Lighthouse for kids to be rescued.
