

The government shut down schools on March 11th, and currently the time for reopening has been extended to July 1st. So, the boys have been busy helping paint walls, putting up ceiling in the office, and mixing manure for fertilizer. We have also planted potatoes in the grow bed and some corn. It has been extremely hot, 100° to 105°, and the wells have gone dry. Thankfully, we do have a truck with a pump and so we go down the mountain to get water. Prior to the lockdown we were able to stock up on food - so we are not in need of food or water.





I am in the U.S. to raise some support, and like many others cannot return home in May as was scheduled. Even when I can return, which looks to be July at the earliest, I will be required to do a minimum of 14 days guarantine before I can be reunited with Maureen and the boys. Please pray for them as Maureen

PANAMA NEWS

Panama, a county of just 4 million people, is one of the most affected countries in Central America by the Covid-19 Virus. In proportion to our population we have experienced much death. The middle of March the government suspended classes in schools, colleges, and universities, and closed most of the shops, etc. We have

a curfew which starts at 5:00 PM, along with departure restrictions. We can go only twice a week for 3 hours to buv medicine or food. Our Churches cannot hold services, but despite all this - we are fine.



The girls attending university are now taking their classes online. Mirian is studying to be a paramedic, Clementina to be a music teacher, and Andrea to be a history teacher.

INDIA NEWS

Covid-19 suddenly made lots of changes in our lives. The 1st week of March corona virus was discovered in India. A week later they declared a holiday for schools until March 31. "Janatha Curfew," which means a lock-down of the whole country for one day was declared by the government March 22.

It was successful, so they declared 21 days of lock-down for the whole country. No buses, no trains, no airplanes - only vegetable markets, and essential commodities are open. Schools are now closed for the summer and the children were promoted to the next class. The exception being the 10th grade class (12th grade in U.S.) which will have to do final exams at a

date which is yet unknown.

At the time of this writing we are still in lock down, but we are all doing fine. We cannot go out, we must maintain 4



feet between us, have now learned to wash our hands every 3 hours with soap and sanitizers, and we hold church services online. We appreciate your prayers. *Matthew Henry*

MEXICO NEWS
