They start school at 9 a.m. and have a lunch break from 12:30 to 1:30 p.m. When classes end at 4 p.m. they come to the hostel, (home) freshen up, and have a snack of fruit. Homework and study time starts at 6 p.m. and ends when supper is served at 8 p.m. Prayer time is from 9 to 9:45 p.m. with a bedtime of 10 p.m.

Recently, viral fevers were everywhere. So, the government health workers came to check everyone. They also gave a lecture on how to take care of our health. They did blood tests and found a few children who are low in their HB count. Some of the children had health issues and are getting the medical treatment they need from the hospital.





Every Wednesday, we have engaged a trained children's minister to teach the children songs and Bible lessons. This will help strengthen what they are regularly taught in Sunday school as well as daily devotions. Many of the new children are not from a solid Christian background. Pray for these children, and we again thank you.
